What is Sports Premium?

Annie Lennard Primary School has been awarded a Sports Premium Grant annually since 2013/14 academic year. The formula changed for the 2017/18 academic year, meaning school now receive approximately £18,000 per year, based on our current intake. This is double the amount that we had received prior to 2017/18.

The purpose of this government grant is to improve the provision of PE and sport within schools, with schools being given freedom to choose how best to spend the money in order to do this. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Annie Lennard Primary has decided to spend the money awarded to develop the following areas during 2023 - 2024:

- Improving the quality of teaching and learning in P.E and other relevant subject areas.
- Increasing participation in sporting activities outside of the core curriculum, during lunchtimes and after school.
- Improving pupils' lifestyles and physical wellbeing.
- Ensure all Year 6 pupils can swim 25m before leaving Annie Lennard Primary
